

A regular meeting of the Wakefield City Council was held on Monday, June 26, 2017 at 5:30 P.M. in the Council Chambers of the Wakefield Municipal Building with Mayor DeFavero presiding and leading in the Pledge of Allegiance.

UNFIN- a) Housing Commission Appointment- Granato moved, Tarro seconded,
 FINISHED that the Council approve the Mayor's appointment of Ms. Judith
 BUSINESS Levra to another five year term on the Wakefield Housing Commission, which will begin on July 1, 2017 and terminate on June 30, 2022. Motion CARRIED, all voting yes by roll call vote.

b) Utility Billing Clerk- The City Manager informed the Council that Mrs. Sue Ahonen was hired on as one of the part time Utility Billing Clerk's and began work on June 23, 2017. No action was necessary, however, the Council welcomed Mrs. Ahonen.

c) Bargaining Unit Layoff- After a brief discussion, Mann moved, Tarro seconded, that the Council layoff the least senior Bargaining Unit Employee effective August 22, 2017. Motion CARRIED, all voting yes by roll call vote.

d) Campground Internet- A discussion took place on the options available for enhancing the WI-FI at the campground. Granato moved, Mann seconded, CARRIED, that the Council take no action on the WI-FI.

NEW a) Beach Water Testing- The City was notified that the Western
 BUSINESS Upper Peninsula District Health Department received another grant to test the Sunday Lake Beach water again this summer. The Beach water will be tested weekly for nine weeks at no cost to the City. Test results can be found on the Department of Environmental Quality website: www.deq.state.mi.us/beach/.

- b) June (partial) 2017 Invoices- Mann moved, Wiita seconded, that the invoices be approved as presented and ordered paid. Motion CARRIED, all voting yes by roll call vote.
- c) Utility Billing Software- Granato moved, Mann seconded, that the Council approve a two year Contract with Tyler Technologies for the Utility Billing/Payroll and General Ledger software for a rate of \$10,070 per year, which will expire on July 31, 2019. Motion CARRIED, all voting yes by roll call vote.
- d) American Electric Power- After a brief discussion, Granato moved, Wiita seconded, that the Council approve the Tenth Amendment to Market Based Rate Full Requirements Agreement with AEP, which extends the Delivery Period to January 1, 2025 through May 31, 2027. Motion CARRIED, all voting yes by roll call vote.
- e) City Manager Personal Leave- Granato moved, Mann seconded, that the Council authorize the Payroll Clerk to pay City Manager Richard Brackney for his unused Personal Leave, rather than carry it over to the next fiscal year. Motion CARRIED, all voting yes by roll call vote.
- f) Budget Amendments- After a brief discussion, based on the recommendation of the City Treasurer and Finance Committee, Granato moved, Mann seconded, that the Council adopt the Budget Amendments in various accounts. Motion CARRIED, all voting yes by roll call vote.
- g) Utility Charge off- Granato moved, Wiita seconded, that the Council authorize charging off \$2,189.26 in bad debt that is considered uncollectable for delinquent utility accounts. Motion CARRIED, all voting yes by roll call vote.
- h) Wakefield Fire Department Donation- City Clerk/Firefighter Jennifer Jacobson made a presentation on a donation made by the Fire Department. The Wakefield Volunteer Fire Department donated four Water Rescue Discs (ResQ Discs) which will be mounted in Public Use areas around Sunday Lake and can be used during any type of water emergency should the need arise. The Fire Department will also house two on the primary response vehicles. No action was necessary, but the Council thanked the Fire Department.
- i) Gravel Bids- Tarro moved, Mann seconded, that the City accept the \$10/yard bid from Smily's Excavating for 1,000 yards of 22A road gravel. Motion CARRIED, all voting yes by roll call vote.



Marcia Jurakovich thanked the Fire Department; multiple comments were heard on the Wi-Fi at the Campground.
